1. Completion of a C or better in ENG 101, ENG/RES 104, MATH 112 (or higher), COM 101, EDU 100, EDU 200, EDU 202

2. GPA 2.75 or higher

3. Admissions Essay

4. Application

5. All grades must be C or better and students can only retake a class one time

6. Completion of 10 service learning hours in EDU 100

7. Completion of 20 school-based hours in EDU 200

8. Completion of Admission Interview
